Probate Inventories of Bristol Part 3: Selected Examples from the Prerogative Court of Canterbury

Yoshihiko Okabe †

This article includes two selected probate inventories from the probate records of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury (PCC) in The National Archives (TNA).

The inventories of rich and wealthy people tended to undergo probate in the PCC, the most prestigious probate court in England. If an individual had personal property in more than one diocese, he had to go through the PCC because the Bishop of Bristol had no jurisdiction in the Diocese of Gloucester. Thus, in order to obtain complete information on the number of surviving inventories for each area, it would be necessary to research not only local records but also the probate records of the PCC in the TNA.

In this article, two high value inventories are selected from probate records of the PCC in the TNA. We can see lives of wealthy merchants in Bristol in the mid-eighteenth century from these selections.

本稿の目的はイギリス国立公文書館（The National Archives, 以下 TNA）に所蔵されているカンタベリー大権裁判所（Prerogative Court of Canterbury, 以下 PCC）の検認記録におけるブリストル地域の検認遺産目録を整理し、活字化して公開することである。

引き続き、カンタベリー大権裁判所の検認遺産目録を PROB 31 シリーズから活字化した。
