

Probate Inventories of Bristol Part 6 : Selected Examples from the Prerogative Court of Canterbury

This article includes two selected probate inventories from the probate records of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury (PCC) in The National Archives (TNA).

The inventories of rich and wealthy people tended to undergo probate in the PCC, the most prestigious probate court in England. If an individual had personal property in more than one diocese, he had to go through the PCC because the Bishop of Bristol had no jurisdiction in the Diocese of Gloucester. Thus, in order to obtain complete information on the number of surviving inventories for each area, it would be necessary to research not only local records but also the probate records of the PCC in TNA.

In this article, two high value inventories are selected from probate records of the PCC in TNA.
